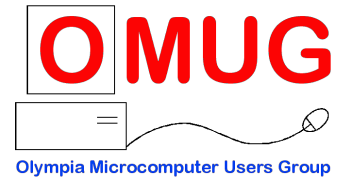

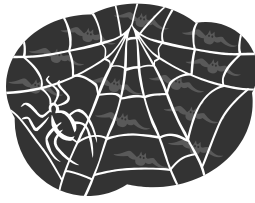

### Home page:

The homepage has basic information about OMUG and any specific upcoming events. For instance, just as you look at it there is information about our holiday party on December 12 and a signup sheet.

### Current and archived issues of our Newsletter can be found:

<http://www.oly mug.org/omug-newsletters/> Just click the link of the newsletter you want and a pdf version will pop up for you. You do need the Adobe reader to read it.

**Over on the right** you will find several features that are new to OMUG. This is possible due to our new Word Press format, that automatically sets this up, based on the design we use for the site.

**Recent posts** are either posts from members or articles posted by the webmaster that are related to computer, iPods', iPhones, or images. If you would like to post something, or comment on an article, go to the Leave a Reply or post the comment section at the bottom of the article. I will need to approve your posting, and OMUG members in good standing may become users of this feature.

**Recent comments** are listed next, and you may respond to the comment yourself if you'd like. Again, you need to be an OMUG member in good standing. Once you are registered with the website, you may make comments.

**Categories** are the various categories the posts fall into. Before the post is posted, I attach it to one or two or more categories. also may add new categories as interests develop. Take a look at the list and see if you'd like anything added.

One of our members suggests a "for sale/swap" category, so you will see that listed: **For sale, need or trade**. Nothing there yet, but now you know about it!

**Archives** will list with all of the posts arranged by month. So, when the list gets long, you may go back and find that article that you want to reference.

Our site is now designed to be much more interactive and becomes a good place to communicate more broadly with the other members of OMUG.

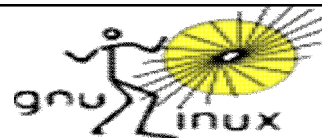

## TAPCUG Linux SIG

**The next TAPCUG Linux SIG meeting is Dec 17, 2013 (3rd Tuesday) 5:30 PM at the SE Tacoma Community Center 1614 99th St E, Tacoma, WA 98445. OMUG Linux SIG meetings are on the 4th Tuesday of the month at the Olympia Center but leader John Wickliffe is out of town November 2013 and the 4th Tuesday in December is Christmas Eve. Always check <http://Linux-Now.us> before going to any TAPCUG or OMUG Linux SIG meetings.**

China, which produces many of the computers we buy, is switching to Ubuntu as its standard operating system. This is a huge development and we should soon have a large choice of Ubuntu computers to buy. ARM processor Chromebooks are top sellers at [Amazon](#), [Best Buy](#), [Office Depot](#), etc. Don't be left behind with old, obsolete technology! Also television and the computer are morphing together where your television is increasingly being controlled by your computer in two way communication rather than a one way stream to you.

We will explore this and look at Bodhi Linux on a Samsung ARM chromebook. ChromeOS, which comes installed on the Chromebook, was primarily designed to work on the internet but people often have the need to work on documents, Emails, etc. offline and there is a way to do that. If you go to your documents or <http://drive.google.com> - More - Offline, you can set up to work offline. Many persons are installing a Linux operating system on ARM Chromebooks which gives them the ability to also work offline with all the usual applications such as LibreOffice, etc. and all the associated features we are used to. Bodhi Linux [just announced](#) they are devoting less time to development on ARM Chromebooks. We will evaluate [ChrUbuntu](#), [Crouteron](#) and other distributions as possible alternatives.

We will review [Lightspark](#) and [Gnash](#). Another possible solution for flash on ARM Linux computers is [here](#), (does anyone know how to do this and make flash for ARM Linux a reality?), [dual booting Linux on a Windows 8 computer](#) (or just buying a Linux computer), [ArkOS](#), [Linux Mint](#), [gsmartcontrol for hard drives](#), [ssh filesharing](#), [message passing interface](#), Ubuntu One photo labeling, [hdmi to TV](#), [recorditnow](#), [Ubuntu Android install](#), [Wordpress](#), [Kubuntu TV](#), [Google TV](#), [Hulu](#), [Roku](#), [Netflix](#), [XBMC](#), [Raspberry Pi](#), [powered hub](#), [vga adapter](#), [Wikitree genealogy](#), [Gedcom files](#), [Gramps genealogy software](#), [Pixel Qi screens](#), [Remastersys and mesh networks](#), [BIOS replacements including UEFI](#), [Coreboot](#), [OpenBios](#), [Plop](#) and [flashrom](#). We also plan to connect other persons computers to the projector so they can demonstrate what they are using. 5, **CryptoLocker: The Worst Malware / Ransomware Ever?** – Jim Evans, Greater Cleveland PCUG. User groups, are you educating your members about the CryptoLocker ransomware? This is malware that when it infects a computer, it starts encrypting every document, spreadsheet, PowerPoint, graphic and photo file it can find. Once everything is encrypted, the malware posts a ransom notice demanding money. Member group, The Greater Cleveland PC Users Group has created a special CryptoLocker page at <http://bit.ly/GCPCUG-CryptoLocker> and updates it regularly with articles, software, tips and video links.

6 **Computer Club of Oklahoma City Recruits MeetUp Group, Bill James, Computer Club of Oklahoma City.** Have you checked MeetUp to see if there is a MeetUp in your area that might fit with your group as a SIG? CCOKC recruited an Investment Business Daily Group that was using MeetUp to announce meeting at a local library. The group was paying \$2.00 per person to defray the cost of room rental; they required a meeting place twice a month with a projector and screen. One of the members of the MeetUp had to bring a projector and screen to each meeting. Our club had just recently disbanded an investment SIG because the leaders were no longer interested in meeting and none of the SIG participants wanted to step up as a leader even though there was still an interest. It was through the efforts of one of our club members who attended this MeetUp and suggested to the leaders that they try our facilities. Our facility has a built-in screen and projector connected to a computer. One of the drawbacks of using the library was also the limited hours which would not be a problem with our facility. After meeting in our facility, they found it to be very accommodating and decided to make it a permanent arrangement resulting with us getting a new SIG and some additional members for our club. 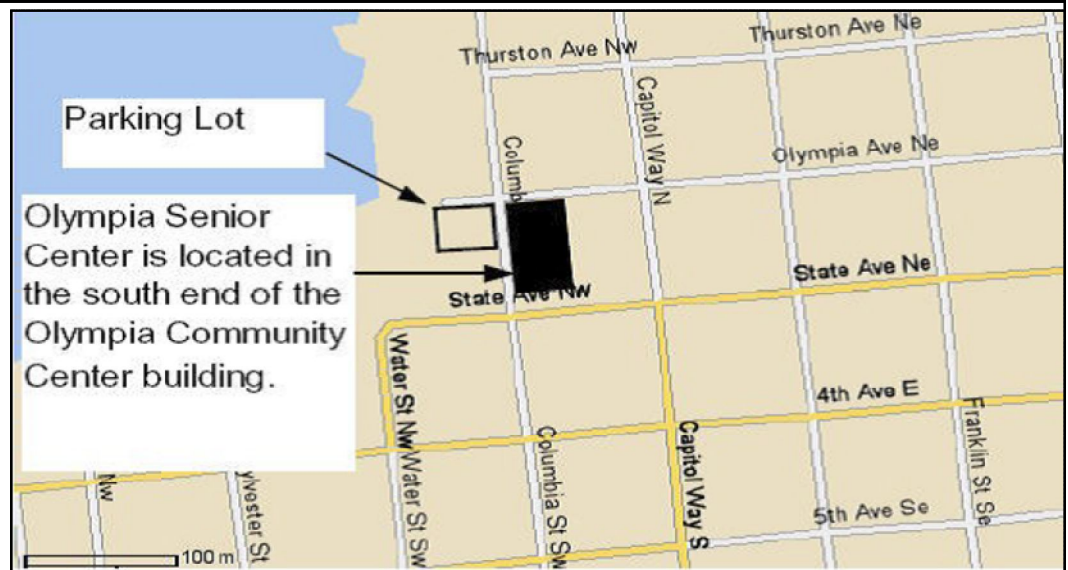
